
Siren alarm: What do you do?







Siren alarm - what do you do?



The Chemelot site has several siren areas. The campus is located in siren area 22.

When the <u>siren alarm</u> sounds, this means there is a major and immediate danger or threat of danger.

The siren alarm starts with a rising wailing tone for 3 seconds, followed by a descending wailing tone for 5 seconds.




This continues for 70 seconds.
An announcement made via the public announcement (PA) system will state which area the alarm relates to and what should be done.





A siren alarm sounds on campus: What do you do?

- Stop your work in a safe manner.
- If you are outdoors, enter a building with RDR immediately.
- Follow the signposting to a reasonably airtight room (RDR; toxic shelter).
- Enter the reasonably airtight room and shut all windows and doors.
- Switch off the ventilation using the stop button.
- Follow the instructions given via the Public Announcement (PA) system and adhere to the arrangements for reporting and assembly that apply to your company or department. BE QUIET and MAKE SURE that everyone can hear the announcement via the PA system
- Remain in the reasonably airtight room (RDR) until you hear the 'all clear' signal or a spoken announcement to that effect via the PA system.
- Minimize your telephone usage.











A siren alarm outside regular working hours



Go to a building with the sign 'RDR inside 24/7'. If your badge does not give you access to that building, you can enter the 24/7 RDR by pushing the emergency button outside the door/sliding doors.



Enter the reasonably airtight room (RDR) and shut all windows and doors.



Switch off the ventilation using the stop button (if present).

Follow the instructions given via the Public Announcement (PA) system and adhere to the arrangements for reporting and assembly that apply to your company or department. BE QUIET and MAKE SURE that everyone can hear the announcement via the PA system.


Remain in the reasonably airtight room (RDR) until you hear the 'all clear' signal or a spoken announcement to that effect via the Public Announcement (PA) system.









Map showing the siren alarm areas and reasonably airtight rooms (RDR's) / toxic shelters








Map showing the siren alarm areas around the campus





The siren alarm sounds when you are in the car park or moving from one location to another

If you are at a car park on campus:

- Get into your car, close the windows, and shut off the ventilation of the car.
- Drive away from the campus. During a siren alarm, you can exit the campus via the crossing gates.

If you are on your way to the campus or have just arrived:

- Drive away from the campus.
- Follow the yellow 'alarm' diversion signs.
- The crossing gates towards the campus are closed

End of the Siren alarm

When the danger has passed, the safety signal will sound. This is a <u>constant tone lasting for 70</u> <u>seconds</u>. This is the <u>end of the siren alarm in siren area 22.</u>










Evacuation: What you should know!







Evacuation - what should you do?



Everybody on campus is permitted to initiate a limited/local evacuation if necessary. The reason for the evacuation (a hazardous situation, an accident or incident, etc.) should be reported as soon as possible to:

Evacuations of a building are announced via the Public Announcement (PA) system. A spoken message is used to announce the evacuation of building on the campus. The instructions giving via the PA system are leading.







An evacuation of a building / location on campus: What now?

Always obey the order to evacuate the building/location where you are currently present.

Stop your work in a safe manner.

Always use the nearest emergency exit to leave the building. Use the emergency staircases to evacuate the building.

The instructions giving via the PA system are leading.




Go to the designated assembly point for the building you are in.
Follow the instructions about the escape route to be taken to reach the assembly location.










Map showing the assembly points on campus




Missing persons

The local supervisor acts as an assembly leader and will determine whether anyone is missing.

A person is considered missing if there are reasons to believe that he/she is currently still in the building/location that is being evacuated. Suspected missing persons are reported to the Duty Officer by calling +31 (0)46 47 64444 or +31 (0)6 2 29 04304. If it becomes clear that persons who were reported as missing are safe, then the assembly leader will cancel the missing person's report.



- Minimize your telephone usage.

- toxic shelter (rdr). Push the button 'emergency stop ventilation'.
- Follow the instructions broadcasted on the public announcement system.
 Wait for the 'all clear' signal (continuous tone).

Evacuation – broadcasted on public announcement system

- Always use the nearest emergency exit to leave the building.
- Go to the dedicated assembly point for the building you are in.
- Follow the instructions broadcasted on the public anouncement system and given by the emergency response team.
